I know that some people will have the urge to want to get together for a social sing and catch up. Could I ask that you resist that as tempting as it may be. Please do not go there. This virus is non judgemental – it is a real leveller. No one is exempt. **No one knows who has the virus until it has been diagnosed or the symptoms become obvious. That can be in a period of 2 to 14 days or even more.** Once again the uncertainties every which way are to be respected. **TIP:** The best way we can all stay safe now is to exercise social distancing - do not gather, do not get caught in a crowd and don't forget the use of soap and water – wash your hands regularly.

On our early morning walk this morning we came across someone we haven't seen for a while. He waltzed straight up and was about to shake hands and I said 'woah – you can't do that now'. We insisted that he keep his distance. His reply to us, which I fear is more prevalent than we realise, was – 'Oh what a load of bullshit'.
